ASIA, MLL 096-10 Ghosts, Monsters and J-Horror (HU) 4 credits 12975

Popular Hollywood remakes of Japanese horror films such as The Ring and The Grudge exposed the worldwide audience to Japanese ghost stories. But Japan has a long tradition of horror stories of ghosts and monsters. This course introduces students to various Japanese horror stories, ranging from the classical texts to "J-Horror," and explores how contemporary forms of popular culture such as anime, manga, and films draw on, or depart from, the traditional images of supernatural beings. Through close analysis of each work, we will consider the questions such as "What's behind our fascination with the ghost stories?" "What are some of the social issues that the horror stories examine?" "What makes us afraid?" Taught in English. Professor Taniguchi T, R; 2:35 - 3:50 p.m.

ASIA, THTR 098-10 Bollywood Dance (HU) 2 credits 14409

Bollywood is a term compounded from "Bombay" (now Mumbai) and "Hollywood," and is India's and the world's largest film industry. Bollywood dance is the movement form used in Indian films -- a unique and energetic style inspired by Indian folk dance and Indian classical dance, Middle Eastern and modern dance. Explore how each of these unique styles combine to create modern Bollywood dance. Learn the fundamental movements, gestures, and expressions that create the Bollywood dance aesthetic, and how they are applied in choreographed sequences. Course Fee \$270.

ASIA, MLL 197-10 Pottery and Porcelain: History, Culture, and Technology along the Silk Road (HU) CBE Global 4 credits 13426

The objective of this course is to examine one of ancient China's representative inventions, porcelain, in its cultural and historical context. Students will study and explore porcelain's international trade in East Asia, Central Asia, and Europe. After a preliminary introduction to the conceptual world of ancient China with its ideological system, students will engage with exemplary Chinese technological achievements in porcelain and its significant impact along the "Silk Road," as well as other important commodities including tea and silk. In this course students will have a close-up opportunity to study the pottery and porcelain collections at Lehigh University and will write their own reflections.

POLS, WGSS, ASIA 397-10 Women's Movement in China (SS) CBE Global 4 credits 14261

This course will examine the state-sponsored, state-directed mass movement for the liberation of Chinese women. Beginning with Confucian notions of mother/daughterhood, to the end of the imperial system, to the role of women in the founding and establishment of the Communist Party of China, to the participation of women and girls in the Great Proletarian Cultural Revolution, gender equality issues have been a central focus of the Party. Women in China have gone from being beasts of burden to being second-class citizens. As the Party has moved to construct and develop Chinese women's consciousness, this course will look at post-reform era women's status and ask, "did the Party liberate women?"
